

A. Treasurer

Checking spreadsheet Summary:

Balance: \$2,362.64

Revenue: \$35,425.00 Expenses (adjusted to NOT include balance transfers since not actual expenses, FY17 expenses carried forward, and June 18 State Director salary to be covered FY19) - \$37,632.40

This represents a [negative] difference of \$2,257.40 between FY18 revenue and expenses ... resulting from fewer than expected teams registering, approved budget items paid, and FY17 expenses paid with FY18 revenue. The result – to get WSO thru Sept 18 expenses – was to transfer \$3,000 from savings to checking. But since we'd transferred \$10,000 from checking to savings in the Fall, net FY18 result was \$7,000 put in savings.

Savings spreadsheet Summary:

- Balance \$24,588.89 with \$1,811 in reserve for Eastern WA = \$22,777.89 available for WSO Contributions \$2,500 from SPEEA grant; \$20.64 from donations Interest \$20.64
- *NOTE: \$10,000 was transferred from checking Fall 2017 as surplus and \$3,000 transferred from savings to checking June 2018 to cover expenses thru Sept 18. Figures don't necessarily indicate what savings is actually available to carry forward in full from FY18 to FY19. Indeed, once FY19 revenue starts coming in, we may have extra funds to transfer from checking to savings.
