Update: Edie & Simon Lie met with Alissa Agnello, Dean of Math and Science, and Sai Guo, Facilities Manager, at North Seattle College on 10/14. They are excited to host a Regional tournament and showed us several labs, classrooms, their gym, and cafeteria space that could work to host either a B regional or a B/C regional. Their 2 largest spaces only hold 500 people each, so that may limit the number of teams that can attend and/or the number of parents that can attend award ceremonies. We don't yet have the inventory of rooms, but I think there's enough space for a combined B/C regional. Highlights include Anatomy and Geology labs with hands-on displays

Conflicts include:

Mar 7 is Central Puget Sound Regional Science Fair, so that date is not ideal for C 2, but could work for a B regional

Mar 14 is beginning of finals week for UW students

Mar 21 is National History Day Regionals, so not good for B

- a) Feedback from coaches about Sustainable Energy

- (1) *"We agree it's a learning opportunity for Middle School students to explore yet another topic., but, here are our concerns:"*
- (2) *"Teams are stressed with 5 students to master 4 topics."*
- (3) *"SE build takes significant time & cost – as students would have to iterate various materials & design."*
- (4) *"No practice tests on SE theory from other invitationals besides Camas. Camas is keeping it as a non-scored event (probably because they have teams from other states)."*

 - a) ~~Add: "The following policies regarding Ethical Disqualification (EDQ) and its consequences (e.g., Annual Warning, probation) apply regardless of whether the penalty is issued for a scored or trial event. If an EDQ is assessed for a trial event that is not normally included in a team's total score, then in addition to the [N + 5] placing assigned for that event, a 5-point penalty may also be applied to the team's overall score per instance of EDQ."~~
